**1) Nonavailability**

Materials are Simply not available in the U.S. in sufficient quantity/ quality.

**2) Unreasonable cost**

Determine by Using the Evaluation Factors Listed Below:

If Domestic offer is not low offer, and the county of origin is NOT listed below, determine reasonableness of the cost:

- a. 6 percent times the lowest offer, from large business; OR
- b. 12 percent, if the lowest domestic offer is from a small business

**For Assembled Equipment**

- a. The article must be manufactured in the United States; and
- b. The cost of domestic components must exceed 50 percent of the cost of all the components.

**3) If any "material" comes from these countries under these agreements, treat that offer as a domestic offer.**

#### WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- \* an existing published wage determination
- \* a survey underlying a wage determination
- \* a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- \* a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

2.) If the answer to the question in 1.) is yes, then an interested party (those affected by the action) can request review and reconsideration from the Wage and Hour Administrator (See 29 CFR Part 1.8 and 29 CFR Part 7). Write to:

The request should be accompanied by a full statement of the interested party's position and by any information (wage payment data, project description, area practice material, etc.) that the requestor considers relevant to the issue.

3.) If the decision of the Administrator is not favorable, an interested party may appeal directly to the Administrative Review Board (formerly the Wage Appeals Board). Write to:
